Junior Ice Hockey - Emergency Action Plan

The Junior Ice Hockey Emergency Action Plan involves the appointment of three individuals to specific roles, which they would assume in the event of a medical emergency. That is the Person in Charge, the Call Person and the Control Person.

Person in Charge – Coach or Duty Manager

- Most qualified person available with training in first aid and emergency response
- Familiarize yourself with arena emergency equipment
- Take control of an emergency situation until medical personnel arrive
- Assess injury status of player

Call Person – Team Manager

- Know the location of an emergency telephone
- Have a list of emergency telephone numbers (Parents and/or Ambulance 000)
- Know the directions to Ice Arena
- Know the best route in and out of the Ice Arena for ambulance crew
- Communicate with the Person in Charge and the Control Person

Control Person – Junior Convenor

- Ensure proper room to work for Person in Charge and ambulance crew
- Discuss emergency action plan with: Arena staff, Officials, Players
- Ensure that the route for the ambulance crew is clear and available
- Seek highly trained medical personnel (i.e., MD, nurse) to assist injured player if requested by Person in Charge
